How to obtain written permission from the Department to hunt on areas enrolled in the Hunter Management Program.

The Wyoming Game and Fish Department developed the Hunter Management Area (HMA) program as part of the Private Lands Public Wildlife Access Program. The program provides free hunter access with written permission to large blocks of mixed public and private lands. A hunter is required to obtain permission from the Department prior to hunting an HMA. Permission slips may be obtained over the Internet on the Department's Web site at <http://gf.state.wy.us> for the majority of HMA's. HMA's are either unlimited, limited first-come first-served or limited draw. The Web site will be updated during July after the drawing for big game licenses. Hunters without Internet access can stop by a Game and Fish office or mail a copy of their license(s), vehicle information, self-addressed stamped envelope, and which HMA they want to the PLPW Access Program, 3030 Energy Lane, Casper, WY 82604.
