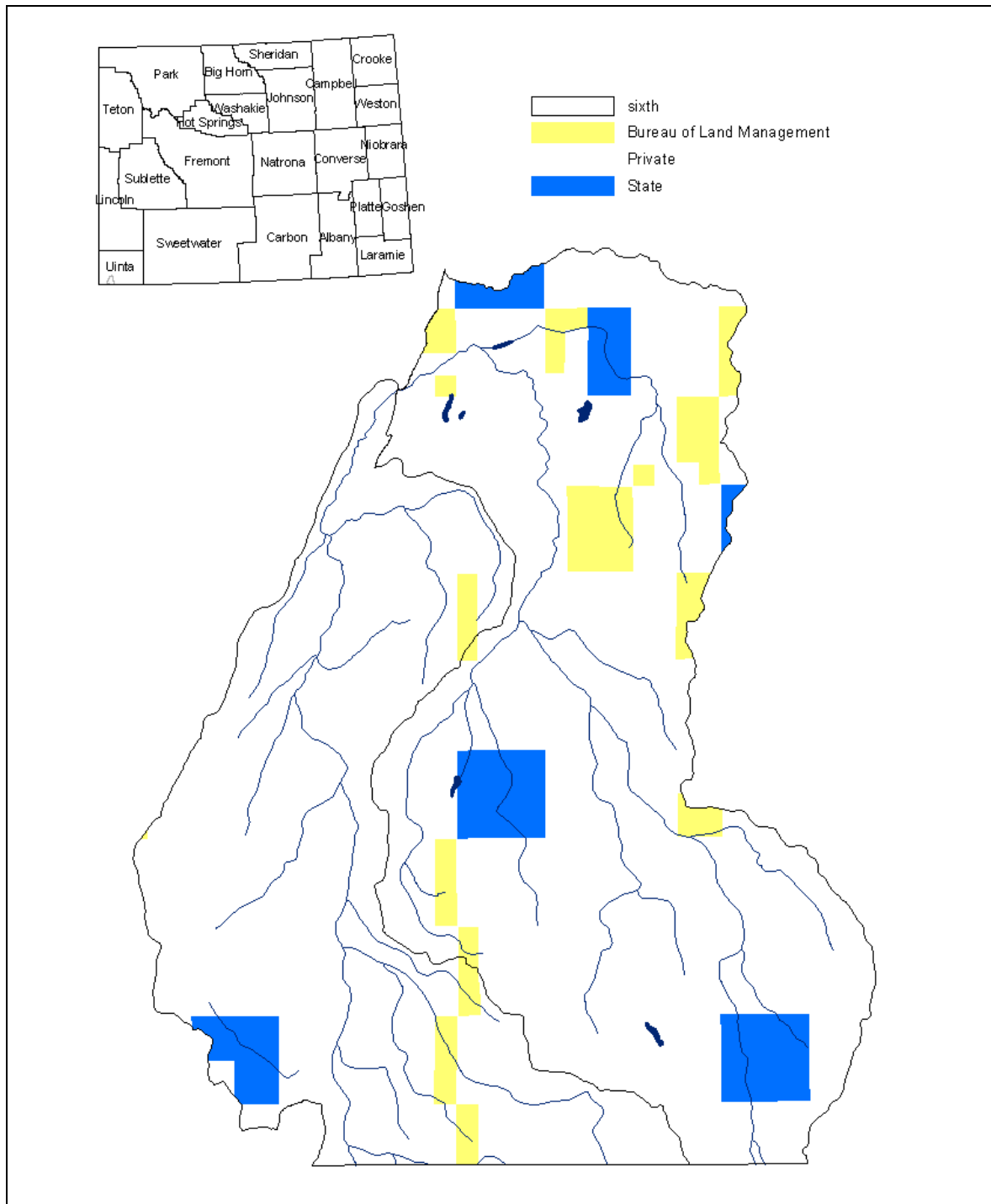

CURRENT HABITAT CONDITIONS/LIMITING FACTORS:
