



WYOMING GAME AND FISH DEPARTMENT GAME WARDEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION

Updated: 6/22/2011

All law enforcement personnel including game warden, senior game warden, and regional access coordinator positions are selected by competitive examination, per Wyoming statute. The Wyoming Game and Fish Department is offering the game warden competitive examination at several locations between August 6, 2011 and September 3, 2011, as listed below. The testing sites will proctor the exam. Grading of the exams, notification to applicants, and selecting candidates for interviews will be conducted by the Wyoming Game and Fish Department. Traditionally, there have been very few permanent openings; however, we anticipate increased employment opportunities due to several upcoming retirements. Information regarding exam dates and locations will be updated periodically.

Purpose of Exam: Wyoming statute requires law enforcement positions (game warden and regional access coordinator) be selected based on competitive examination. Exams are typically scheduled once a year, depending on vacancies. Interview candidates will be selected based on a combination of factors including overall test scores, writing ability, number of credit hours in hands-on wildlife courses, grades/transcripts, and job suitability profiling. No single factor will be used to select interview candidates.

Minimum Exam Qualifications: A Bachelor's degree in wildlife management, range management, biology, zoology or ichthyology, including at least 20 hours of coursework in these fields as evidenced on transcripts, are required. Degrees such as criminal justice, education, outdoor recreation, etc. do not qualify). Must have a valid drivers license.

NOTE: Letter from your college authority stating you will have completed college coursework at the baccalaureate level in game or wildlife management, biology, zoology or other closely related field by December 31, 2011 will also be accepted.

Exam Preference Statement: Preference will be given to candidates with the following qualifications: At least 20 hours of wildlife management coursework as evidenced on their transcript, i.e. wildlife management, range management, biology, zoology, ichthyology, etc.

Law Enforcement Requirements: Upon employment, individuals must complete a 12-week Peace Officer Basic Training Course at the Wyoming State Law Enforcement Academy (WLEA) in January 2012. Please review the WLEAs physical fitness assessment standards (available at <http://wleacademy.com> "Basic Programs-Physical Fitness Assessment") to assure *with or without reasonable accommodation*, you can meet the requirements.

Principal Duties/Responsibilities: Primary responsibilities include wildlife management data collection and analysis, enforcement of game and fish laws and regulations, evaluation of damage to crops and livestock by wildlife, and acting as local liaison between the department and the public. A substantial amount of training and all equipment is provided.

Salary: Monthly salary varies depending upon duty assignment, ranging from:

- Game Warden - \$3,564 - \$4,192
- Senior Game Warden and Regional Access Coordinator - \$4,569 - \$5,375

Registration and Examination Process: APPLICATION AND REGISTRATION FOR THE EXAM ARE MANDATORY. DEADLINES FOR APPLICATION AND REGISTRATION VARY, SO PLEASE REVIEW CAREFULLY. The written comprehensive testing portion of the exam will be given at the testing sites noted below. Please follow steps 1 through 5 carefully.

Upon Exam Completion:

Exams will be sent to the WGFD for grading and candidates will be notified of their results. Selected candidates will then be notified of the process for oral interviews and psychological testing, which will be conducted in Cheyenne, Wyoming September 18-20, 2011 (dates subject to change).

- **Psychological Evaluation:** Psychological testing is required for all law enforcement positions. A portion of this testing will be conducted during the interview process.
- **Background Investigation:** Applicants must be willing to submit to a comprehensive background investigation. Any applicant who belongs to a party or organization which advocates the overthrow of the Government of the United States, or who displays poor moral characteristics, will be disqualified (W.S. 9-1-704).

WYOMING GAME WARDEN EXAMINATION SUGGESTED STUDY MATERIALS

Subject Matter

1. WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT (especially big game, upland game, migratory birds, western wildlife species)
 - a. General knowledge—all species—wildlife habitats, food habits, life histories, management techniques, etc.
 - b. Data collection methods and data analysis
 - c. Current wildlife diseases affecting western wildlife resources
 - d. Wildlife damage concerns/implications
 - e. Species identification - western wildlife

2. FISH
 - a. General knowledge – cold and warm water species, distribution, identification, etc.
 - b. Limnology

3. LAW
 - a. Court procedure
 - b. Legal terminology
 - c. Constitutional law; application to arrest, search and seizure, etc.
 - d. General knowledge of federal and state wildlife laws (i.e. Wyoming Statutes Titles 23 and 41)

4. OTHER
 - a. Federal aid programs
 - b. Western protected, threatened or endangered species of wildlife
 - c. Map reading – section, range, township, acreages, UTM's, land status, etc.
 - d. Boating safety and terminology
 - e. General hunting, fishing, and trapping knowledge
 - f. Communication skills (written and verbal) and public relations
 - g. General firearms, archery equipment knowledge
