

Wolf Report
For the week ending June 27, 2008

The state of Wyoming officially assumed management authority for wolves on March 28, 2008. This report covers the period from June 21 through June 27.

Wolf Research

Nothing new this week.

Wolf Monitoring

Wyoming Game and Fish Department personnel continue to closely monitor wolves and wolf activity throughout northwest Wyoming.

Reported Wolf Kills

On June 23, a wolf was accidentally struck and killed by a vehicle in Grand Teton National Park. The death was confirmed by park rangers as a road kill.

Depredation Investigations

Nothing new this week.

Information and Education

Wolf Program Coordinator Mike Jimenez spoke about wolves and wolf management in Wyoming at the National Bighorn Sheep Interpretive Center in Dubois, Wyoming, on June 25. Approximately 30 people attended the event.

The comment period for a number of proposed changes to regulations and seasons, including Chapter 47: Gray Wolf Hunting Seasons, will close at 5 p.m. on July 3, 2008. The Wyoming Game and Fish Commission will take action on these items at its July 30-Aug.1, 2008, meeting in Dubois.
