### **Verified Grizzly Bear Killed Livestock**

- A calf was verified as being injured by a grizzly bear in the Upper Green, BTNF. The injury was detected at gathering and likely happened some time ago while on a Bridger-Teton Forest allotment..

### **Monitoring and Research**

### **Bear Management (Captures, Relocations, and Removals)**

- Captured and moved an adult male grizzly bear from a ranch near Cody. The bear was released on the Caribou-Targhee N.F.
- Removed an adult female grizzly bear from a residential area in the lower South Fork of the Shoshone River near Cody after repeated conflicts and previous attempts at relocating failed.

- Meet with the Park County Commissioners and other Park County staff to discuss human-bear conflict prevent efforts at the Clark landfill.
